

Prinyer's Cove - July 10 - 12

By six-thirty Friday evening, it was apparent that the cruise list had been whittled down by unforeseens and other priorities to two vessels. Undaunted, the tortoise and hare team of our little Edel and the Krugers' speedy trimaran began beating up the Amherst Island channel into a moderate to light westerly breeze. The tri, with its young crew, showed admirable restraint in moderating its pace to our more leisurely gait, and as darkness fell and we were sailing by the light of a half-moon, its running light would occasionally bear down on us and a disembodied voice from the looming silhouette would advise that shoaling water ahead might be reason to come about.

A little after eleven P.M., we were picking our way gingerly through the more than thirty sleeping vessels already moored in

Prinyer's Cove quiet darkness, then trying to anchor, raft-up and batten down without wakening the dead. Late Saturday morning after a leisurely breakfast and swim, by mutual consent we sailed down to Glenora into a fresh westerly and then ran back to the cove in time for supper. There we were joined by the Unsworths who had sailed up under main-only after losing the jib halyard while changing sails.

Sunday morning saw over fifty vessels moored in the tranquil cove, and after breakfast the tri's young crew made a surprising amount of change going around and offering to take garbage ashore. We also winched Gord up to his masthead to reeve his jib halyard, this went quite well except for the deep indentation left by Gord's fingertips in the aluminum when a power boat wake sent the mast rocking through what seemed like 60° of arc.

We were joined for lunch by the Wrights and Adams who powered down to help round out a most enjoyable week-end. Because of thunderstorm warnings, we took the "inside" route back home on a broad reach all the way. The cruise, though small in numbers, was loads of fun - particularly the moonlight sailing - and showed why Prinyer's Cove is a boater's favourite stop-over.

Twenty-four boats entered this year which made for an interesting race.


There was an award for the first to cross the finish line, which went to Paul Kruger.
