I would like to find someone to sail with me on my Northern 25.

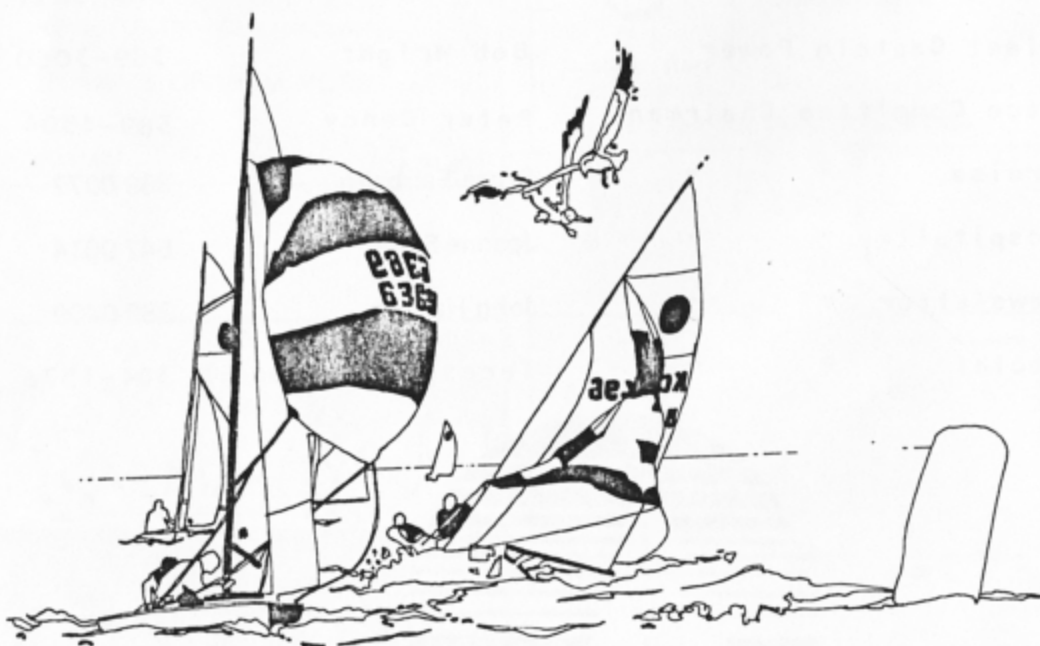
I am retired so I would like to find someone who is free to sail during the week. I am also interested in crewing on race nights. (My boat is not equiped for racing.)

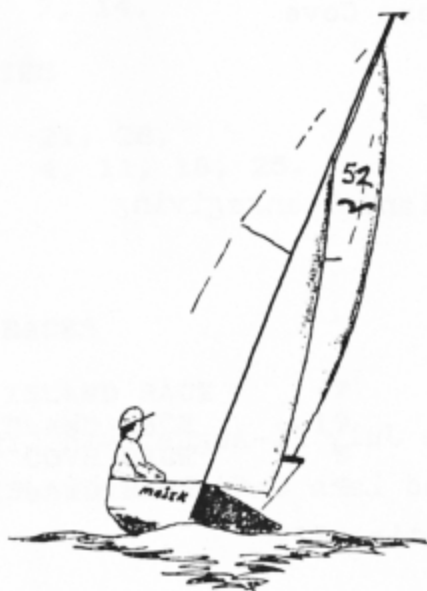

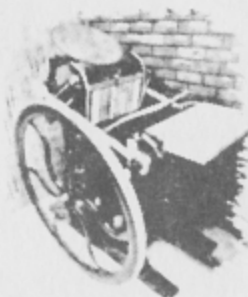
