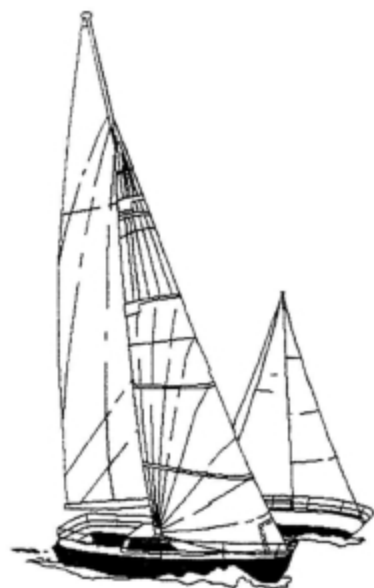

To date we have removed 43,000 cubic yards of silt from the Marina and we hope to complete the project by mid - December. Our thanks to the Club members for their support and understanding throughout all these sometimes inconvenient projects. We welcome any suggestions or comments you may have.
