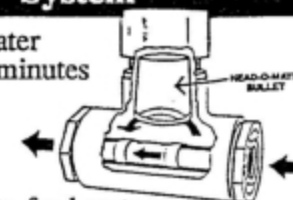

Racing

Thursday Night Racing

Format

Same as last year with one exception. All attempts will be made to sail windward/leeward courses. A race will consist of a series of legs depending upon weather conditions, light, and length of course.

Racing Category

All yachts will be able to sail under the guidelines of category B from the appendix A3 - Advertising and event categories in the International Yacht Racing Rules.

Starting

Proper sound signals and flags will be employed again to indicate starting sequences, course, and legs to be sailed. a course will be sailed from an imaginary starting line marked by a flagged drop mark to leeward of the race committee boat. The leeward mark of the course will be the former flag end of the start. Marks of the course will be rounded to port.

Finishing

When a downwind finish is intended the race committee will be on station with a finishing mark to starboard. In the event of a windward finish, the race committee boat will be on station with a finishing mark to port.

Shortening Course

A course may be shortened prior to the lead boat rounding what would then be the last mark before the finish. The race committee shall use a sound signal (whistle, air horn) in multiple succession as each yacht rounds the last mark. The race committee will then be on station to finish the yachts.

Full Moon Boogie

Beginning in June we will be sponsoring a short night race after the formal racing has finished. The dates will be June 23, July 21, Aug 18, and Sept 15. Course and distance will be determined on the date.

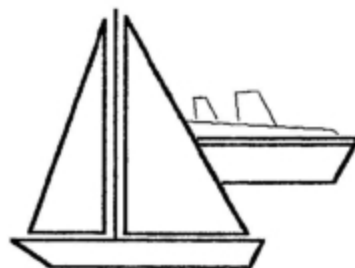

A Word About I-68'S

An I-68 is a permit issued upon application to non U.S. residents that permit the holder to travel inside the U.S. within 25 miles of the border without having to report to U.S. Immigration. A recent visit to U.S. Immigration at the Thousand Isle Bridge brought these points to my attention.

- Everyone on board your vessel requires an I-68 except children under 18. They can be named on either parents I-68. (New)
- I-68's have to be applied for in person if you were not a holder last year. (New)
- You are still required to report to U.S. Customs upon entry to the U.S. This can be done using a toll free number that is available.

Those members who do not have an I-68 are encouraged to apply for one before the sailing season gets under way. The Cruise Committee have proposed several club cruises this year that will be stopping at a number of U.S. Ports.

While talking with Immigration Officials, I tried to pick up applications for other members of C.B.Y.C. but was advised that this was no longer possible. EACH individual has to apply IN PERSON. Perhaps inconvenient, but that is the Law. Without this document everyone would have to report to U.S Immigration as well as U.S. Customs on EACH VISIT.

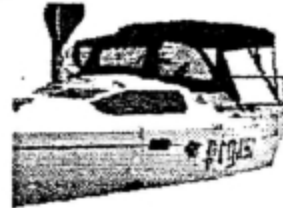

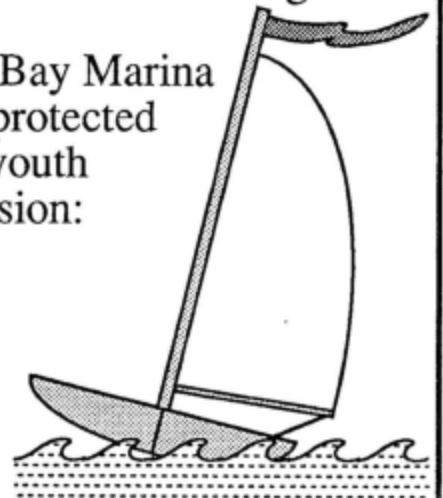
Collins Bay Yacht Club Sailing Camp

Collins Bay Yacht Club is offering a sail training day camp for youth nine years of age and older and an adult evening programme. The day camp is in two-week sessions from July 4 to August 26, 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Instruction is by Canadian Yachting Association certified instructors in CBYC dinghies; C.Y.A. Certificates of Achievement are awarded upon completion of each level.

White Sail (Levels I, II & III) cover basic sailing knowledge, safety procedures, rules of the road and plenty of sailing. Bronze Sail (Levels IV & V) include spinnakers, heavy weather sailing, advanced theory and boat maintenance. Silver Sail (Level VI) provide an introduction to racing.

The camp is on the grounds of Collins Bay Marina with sailing on Collins Bay providing protected waters and good breezes. Fees for the youth programme are \$275 per two-week session: an adult evening programme is also available at \$175 per session.
