



A Word About I-68's

An I-68 is a permit issued upon application to non U.S. residents that permit the holder to traavel inside the U.S. within 25 miles of the border without having to report to <u>U.S. Immigration</u>. (Not Customs) U.S. Immigration at the Thousand Isles Bridge brought the following points to my attention.

- Everyone on boaard your vessel requires an I-68 except children under 18. They can be named on either parents I-68.
- I-68's have to be applied for in person if you were not a holder from last year.
- You are still required to report to U.S. Customs upon entry, using a Toll Free number.

Those members who do not have an I-68 are encouraged to apply for one before the season gets under way, without it you must report to both Immigration and Customs on each visit. Each individual has to apply in person.
