COLLINS BAY MARINA NEWS

It has been one of those summers you never want to see end and so I feel guilty for saying this but, haul out is just around the corner. Our two haulout weekends are Saturday October 14 (boats up to 27') and Saturday October 21 (boats 28' and longer). Bill Learmonth tells me he will have the Clubhouse coffee shop operating on these two days providing hungry mouths with homebaked goodies, sandwiches, soup and drinks. A haulout schedule will be posted on the bulletin board in October. We can also haul out on weekdays between 8 am and 4:30 pm by appointment. Mast de-stepping is available during our regular business hours and in the evenings by appointment. The mast crane is not available on October 14 and 21. D & M Cleaners will be on site once again for bottom washing.

Weeds! This has been a record year for weed growth throughout the area. A number of factors contributed to this problem: a mild winter, early spring, low water, zebra mussels and a hot, sunny summer. If conditions don't return to normal next year, we will harvest the channel. In the meantime, the path of least resistance is through our marked channel, stay close to the government dock (20 metres) and then stay about 200 metres offshore until you are well past the bridge.

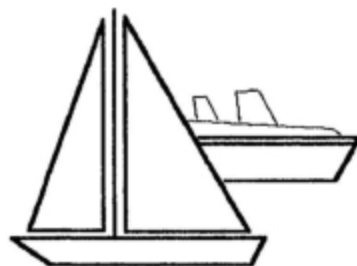
