

MORE NOTES FROM THE COMMODORE

During the last few weeks of winter a number of boats at Collins Bay were broken into, resulting in vandalism and minor theft. I think we experience a sense of frustration from knowing that someone has violated our privacy and that there was little that we could do about it. These isolated acts of criminal activity are almost impossible to prevent without using extremely expensive methods.

What I suggest is that as a club, we should get to know the other people on our dock. Let's introduce ourselves to new neighbours and get to know who belongs and who doesn't. Let's work with the Marina Staff and report any suspicious persons or activities to Hub and Michele who will then take appropriate action.

If this method sounds vaguely familiar, it should! I is a variation of the successful "Neighbourhood Watch" program where everyone provides a little security to his/her area. In our setting, we call it the Marina Watch program.

It won't take long for word to get around among would-be thieves, that Collins Bay Marina is not the place to ply their unsavoury trade.





RACING - CBYC - 1996

We had a great year of racing last year and hope this year will be even better. A detailed set of CBYC Racing Instructions will be ready for the start of the season, but here are a few of the highlights.

In response to requests for a number of members, we will have a mixture of longer and shorter races. The short races will be as last year, the longer races will use two permanent marks out beyond the Brother Islands. Henk Muis has kindly agreed to construct these marks. Courses will be Windward - Leeward, and we will again have two classes based on PHRF handicaps. Every one will start together but the higher handicap boats will sail a shorter course. This will enable us to get in more than one race on a Thursday evening when the weather co-operates. This system worked well last year.

We have had no protests for the past three years, and we hope this continues. To encourage skippers who may be in the wrong to accept a penalty rather than go through the hassle of a protest hearing and risk a disqualification, we will have an in-club rule that all penalties will be a 360 turn rather than a 720. This rule modification applies only to the Thursday night series and not to the Long Distance Races.

A number of sailors have indicated interest in a combined Cruise / Race event. Maxine Cohrs and myself have had some preliminary discussions on this. One idea is a cruise and overnight to Confederation Basin / Cedar Island Area and a race back to Collins Bay Marina using split starts (ie with the handicap being applied at the beginning of the race so that the first boat back wins. More on this idea later.

Entrance fees for racing are unchanged at \$10 per boat per series, and \$10 for each long distance race. All yachts entered in CBYC sponsored races must be insured for personal liability and property damage.

1996 is centennial year for Kingston Yacht Club. Almost all of their weekend races will be open, and I have been told that we at CBYC will be specially welcome to participate.

Your race committee members are Henk Muis, Bill Learmonth, Bruce Rand, Ben Rotteveel, Ian Whitfield as handicapper, and myself as Chairman. We welcome suggestions or comments from any club members. See you on the water


