And while you are at it are the dates on your flares current (Three years is the limit I think) and does your crew know how to use them. This always brings up the question of VHF radio and crew knowledge of emergency procedures. In any case these and other safety items are worth reviewing every year to make sure the enjoyment isn't marred by tragedy or compounded by insufficient training of crew ( Even the occasional passenger should be briefed ) Our Fleet Captain **Mike Mastrianni** is our **Safety Officer** too and will be happy to advise on any of these items.

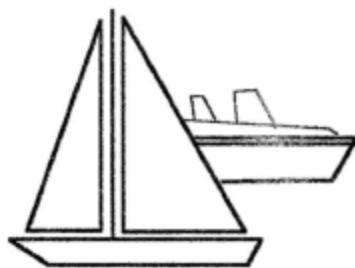

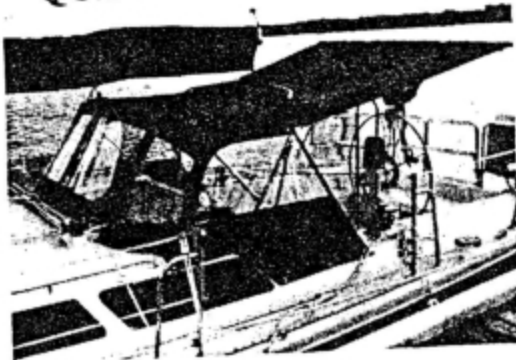

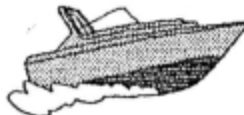
