

In any case these and other safety items are worth reviewing every year to make sure the enjoyment isn't marred by tragedy or compounded by insufficent training of crew (Even the occasional passenger should be briefed) Our Fleet Captain Mike Mastrianni is our Safety Officer too and will be happy to advise on any of these items.






