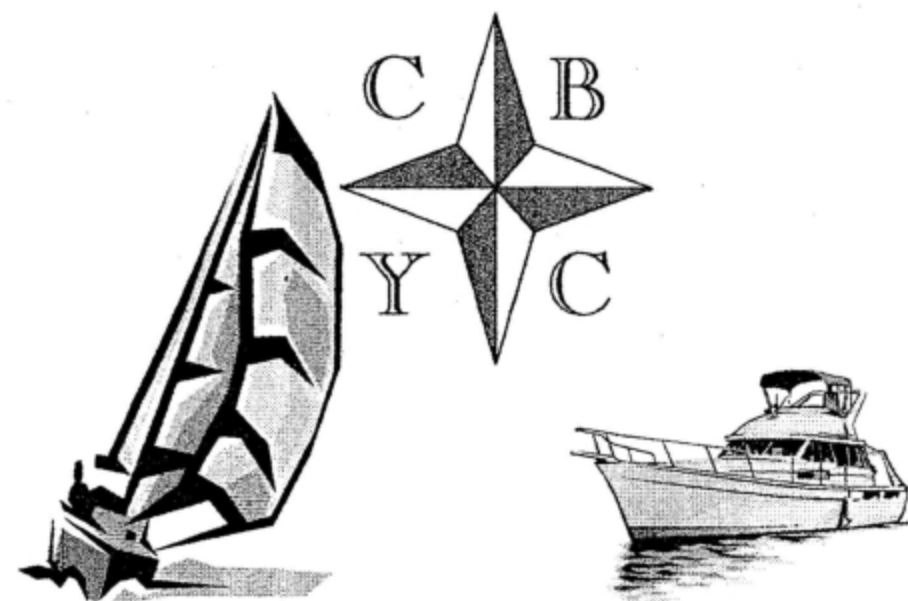

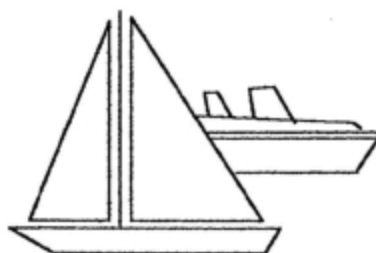

COLLINS BAY MARINA NEWS

Dingy Dock gets \$20,000 "Facelift" !

With dingy sailing in the sheltered waters of Collins Bay growing in popularity, we felt it was time to upgrade the dingy dock to the high standard of the rest of the docks. Many think that building a dock is simple. You get a bundle of lumber, styrofoam, nails and go to it. Well, yes but, for our new dinghy dock, built primarily for the sailing school, we've gone the extra mile. The new dock with a capacity of more than 10 dinghies has a number of special features. An obvious one is the low freeboard to match that of the small dinghies. Perhaps less obvious is the open span design which lets surface debris wash by under the dock. Then there is the floatation, steel of course, for longevity. The large diameter, half-moon design offers a high degree of floatation per inch of immersion, a factor which increases as the load increases. What's that mean? It takes 12 people to lower the dock two inches. The dock has a "dog-leg" midway along its length. Not just a regular old 90° dog-leg, but a 70° one. This adds stability to the structure and optimally lines the dock up perpendicular to prevailing weather. This allows sailors to dock and depart facing head to wind. Add 24 cleats for flexibility and you have a professional dock built to Collins Bay Marina standards.

Our thanks for the suggestions that have been filling our new suggestion boxes. A common request has been for water on the docks. We are working on this -- we drilled a shore well last fall and if the system tests ok and produces the necessary flow rate, we will begin installing drinking water on the docks as soon as we can.



Thank you to all the folks who made the family day and sail past go so well. The great turn out and participation indicated the planning and advertising was done in a professional manner. Of course the fact I "ordered" my kids and grand kids to show up wasn't a factor - because they came anyway! The Editor.



CBYC - Sail Training Camp



Collins Bay Yacht Club is offering sail training day camps for youth nine years of age and older and an adult evening programme. The day camp is in two week sessions from June 30 to Aug 22, 9 AM til 4 PM. Instruction is by Canadian Yachting Association certified Instructors in CBYC dinghies; CYA Certificates of Achievement are awarded upon completion of each level.

White Sail (Levels I, II, and III) cover basic sailing knowledge, safety procedures, rules of the road and plenty of sailing. Bronze Sail (Level IV and V) include spinnakers, heavy weather sailing, advanced theory, and boat maintenance. Silver Sail (Level VI) provides instruction for racing.

Rates are \$275 for members (\$290 regular) with 10% off for 2nd member of family. There is a further reduction of 15% for taking a second session.
