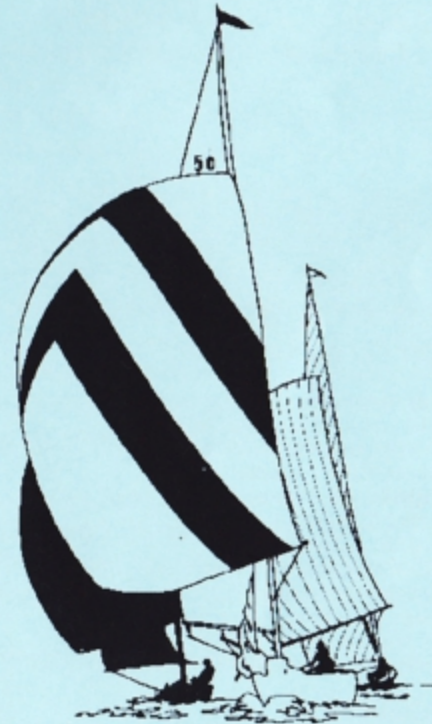

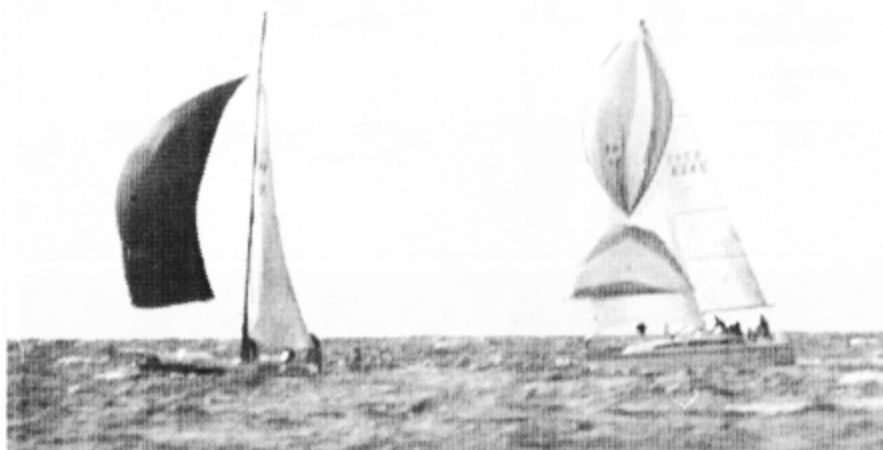

## SAILPAST PROCEDURES

Dress your boat BEFORE the sailpast. Put up all the flags and burgees that you have on your boat, to make this a very colourful and interesting event for all participants and the spectators on Bath Road.

At 1:30 p.m., the Commodore will be on station to take the salute from a position far out in the bay, where there is lots of sailing room and the water is deep. VHF 09 will be monitored.

The sailing order will be:

FIRST, sailing sailboats, boats LOA 30 ft. and greater;  
SECOND, all other sailing sailboats; and  
THIRD, all craft, sail or power, using their engines only.

Each class should try to line up by size, largest boats first. If sailing, leave at least three boat lengths between boats.

How do you salute the Commodore? You don't—she salutes you. As you approach, you should be on a beam reach. All persons on your boat should stand at attention, facing the Commodore, who gives the salute. At the same time, your boat salutes the Commodore. If a sloop, luff the jib; if a catboat, ease the sheet to luff the sail; if a power boat or sail boat under power, gather the Canadian flag on the flagstaff and release it after receiving the Commodore's salute and passing her boat.
