How time flies when you're having fun! It's been a fantastic summer and now it is already time to start planning for the fall haulout. New members to Collins Bay in particular will want to know that haul out is any weekday, any time by appointment, during September and October. Just give us a call to arrange the details. If you prefer a Saturday haulout, boats up to 27' long can be hauled out on Saturday, October 17. Boats 28' - 36' long can be hauled on Saturday, October 24. For boats larger than 37', please call us to make an appointment. Mast destemming is available seven days a week (excluding October 17 & 24) by appointment on a first come, first serve basis.



We are pleased to have been of assistance in helping with some clubhouse maintenance. On August 13 the beautiful spiral staircase built by Paul Kruger was removed. It has served the club well, but unfortunately nothing lasts forever. Henry Muis helped our staff remove the structure using the backhoe. Our staff and equipment will be available to install the new steel staircase when it arrives.

Hub did some scuba diving to check out the integrity of the clubhouse flotation. A detailed report was submitted to the club executive. In summary, the flotation is intact and ready for the next big BBQ. Some of the plastic barrels are dented in and there is a heavy load of zebra mussels covering the entire bottom. There are a number of options for raising the freeboard of the clubhouse but in the meantime, there is no cause for alarm.

We hope to see many of you at the Pigeon Island Race and BBQ. The Pigeon Island Race is sponsored by Collins Bay Marina and all are welcome to participate -- we have a very nice prize to present to the captain of the winning boat at the Awards Banquet!
