"Early season ventures out onto the lake may have a few surprises for you"

- The water is still very, very cold, the sun now gives off a great deal of heat, this combination can create some unexpected and very dense fog banks.
- Make sure you are prepared for them, navigation equipment fully functioning.
- Communication via VHF and the now popular cell phone should be always at their ready best.
- The most important: PFD's, at the ready, one for each aboard, and the proper sizes.
- Keep the Shakedown Cruise close-in and in familiar waters.

Canadian Compliance Plate law as of April 1, 1999

Capacity plate states the safe limits for the vessel:

- recommended outboard engine size up to 6m and 7.5kw engine
- number of persons on board
- Maximum total load, persons & equipment
- Confirms vessel built to Can. Gov.t Standards

Each operator must know and respect the limitations of their vessel, overloading is dangerous.

The Single Vessel Plate is issued to homebuilt boats built by a builder no longer in business instead of a Capacity or Conformity Plate.

If you are buying, building or importing a boat, you are responsible for ensuring that your boat has a Capacity, Conformity, or Single Vessel Plate. Plates can only be obtained from the builder. If this is not possible, contact the office of Boating Safety on how to obtain a plate and the usual fees.



### THE 2000 EASTER SEALS REGATTA



Here's a great opportunity for CBYC members to raise money for Easter Seals while enjoying a day out on the lake doing what we love to do! Come to the 2000 Easter Seals Regatta on June 24th held out of the Kingston Yacht Club.

Last year four of our member yachts (Stardust IV, Black Knight, Be R Guest & Motivation), joined about 25 others and helped raise close to \$45,000. This was more per capita

than any other Easter Seals Regatta in the country! It was the third time that the Regatta has been held in Kingston and resulted in a \$13,000 increase over 1998.

The Regatta includes a "Sail Past" with tall ships for the onshore audience, where your sponsors banners are seen and announced. There is also a race, after which the finishing times for each boat can be adjusted by "bribing" the organizers, with all bribes going to Easter Seals. Last year, the "winning" boat, our own *Be R Guest*, bought her way to the podium through effective use of the "bribe bucket". The best dressed crew were the Red Lobster's who sailed on our own *Stardust IV*.

This year the Regatta will be held Saturday, June 24th with a reception on the Friday evening for crews and their sponsors. KYC graciously invites visiting boats to stay overnight and arrangements are being made at Confederation Basin for free dockage.

A sponsorship is \$250 which includes an invitation to the pre-race reception, the sponsor name on a banner which you fly from your lifelines, a thank-you gift package, and an invitation to the post-race BBQ and awards ceremony.




