A big thank you to Norma and Dennis for making us all feel so welcome. Next episode requires croquet players for suc-



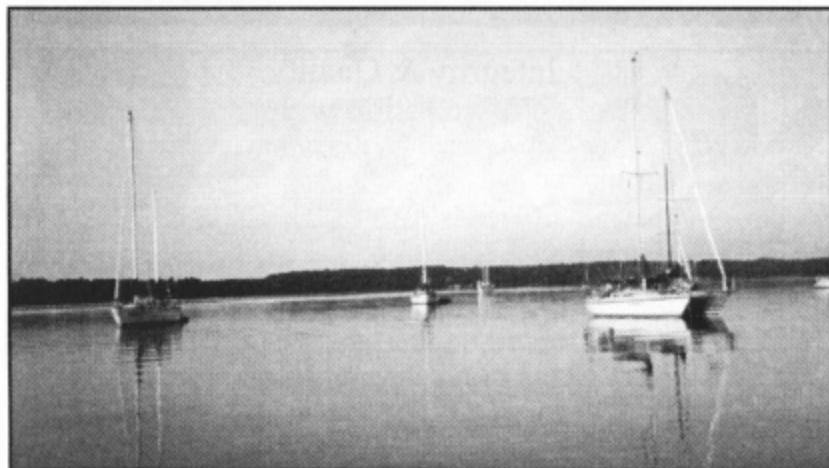

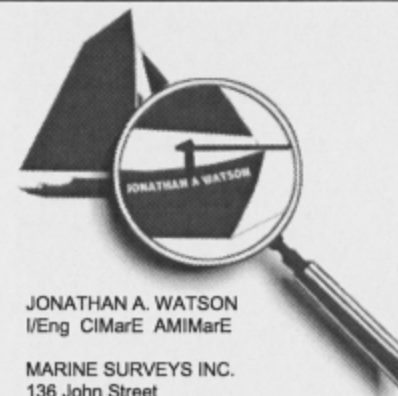
