
retrieve an unconscious person. The demonstration was narrated by our Commodore, Phil Morris. A big thanks to Merv Cameron for organizing the drill.


The Search and Rescue Helicopter demonstration was absolutely fabulous! First, the helicopter dropped a diver into the water 500' west of the break wall. Then it circled back and picked up the diver using a basket on a winch cable. The second rescue was particularly interesting. The helicopter dropped a diver again, circled back, landed on the surface of the water and motored around like a motorboat. It motored right up to the diver who was helped into the door by rescue crew. Spectators were awed by the power and agility of the Labrador Helicopter as it performed its manoeuvres. As someone in the audience said, "it was totally cool!"

Another part of the event saw the OPP christening the new E.V. McNeil II in a formal maritime ceremony. We are proud that the E.V. McNeil II will be calling Collins Bay Marina her home port this summer.

# MEMBERSHIP UPDATE - June 2002


## Renewals:



# **EASTER SEAL REGATTA 2002**



Don't forget to mark your calendars for the Easter Seal Regatta being held Saturday, June 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2002 at KYC. Last year the event raised more than \$65,000 for children with physical disabilities in our community. It is a great event, both for the Easter Seal Society, as well as from an interclub relations perspective.

How do I get involved you ask? Simply obtain at least one \$300 sponsor whose name will be on a banner that you display on your lifelines throughout the day, including the fun race and sailpast. There is a fundraising incentive program for skippers. Those bringing in two sponsors will receive a cooler bag, four will earn a folding camp chair, all the way up to 20+ earning a Storm-Tek 3-in-1 jacket. There are prizes for the best dressed boat and the best dressed crew. Race results are always a surprise after being adjusted through effective use of the "Bribe Bucket", which CBYC has used very successfully in the past. As a club, we pooled our resources to help the CBYC boat with the best time in the preliminary results, move to the winners circle.

As a boat owner, you're entitled to overnight mooring at KYC (overflow at Confederation Basin), a regatta T-shirt, two invitations to the Friday night pre-race reception, and tickets for your crew to attend the post-race party and ceremonies Registration forms will be available in the clubhouse and at the marina office, or contact the Easter Seal Society at 547-4126.


