As reported in the June MIXER, your Executive is planning to put forth a bid to host the 2004 Eastern Yacht Council (EYC) Annual Regatta. This event will bring prestige to CBYC as a host location for this and future events, as well as put Collins Bayon the map as an Eastern Lake Ontario sailing destination. The Regatta is scheduled for Thursday, July 8 through Saturday, July 10. The volunteer support of CBYC members is key to ensuring we meet our goals of not only hosting a memorable event, but bringing no financial burden to the club.

There are three distinct phases to this event: Planning, Development and Execution. The **Planning** phase runs from now until our bid is presented in April 2003. During this time we will work on the details of the plan in order to truly understand what is needed to make the event a success. This includes researching required permits, identifying required property changes, training Race Committee and Protest Committee staff, and sorting out sponsorship requirements to ensure the financial success of the event.

The **Development** phase is April 2003 through April 2004. During this time we will attend to long-term preparation needs, line-up sponsors, begin promoting the event amongst sailors, as well as obtain firm commitments from volunteers.

The final phase, **Execution**, is April 2004 through April 2005. This phase requires the most active support from CBYC volunteers. During this time we will finalize last minute details, confirm sponsorships, actually run the Regatta and perform post event duties, such as clean up, report preparation and financial reconciliation. While the Regatta itself is one week in July 2004 for most volunteers, there will be follow up activity for some of the organizing committee members.

s noted earlier, this event is being planned with the understarding that it must pay for itself -- that CBYC will not be left with a debt as a result of this event. Much planning is required to ensure we meet this goal.

Our immediate need is for volunteers to help with planning and promotion. Required skills include legal (to help interpret Municipal By-laws), corporate writers (to help put together sponsorship proposals), people with Food / Beverage and Entertainment backgrounds and people with access to print services.

Finally, it should be noted that one of the goals of the EYC 2004 committee is to re-invest in our membership base. Therefore, if any member has business services that would be of benefit to this event, please contact me to discuss your support and sponsorship.

Next year, Trident Yacht Club will be joining KYC and CBYC in the fun and camaraderie for a two day regatta. Consider coming out



The club burgee was designed bu our first commodore, Bob Wright, establishing the compass rose with CBYC as the club logo and blue and white as the club colours.


IN 1983, the special burgees below were introduced to designate the commodore, vice commodore and past commodores of our club.
