more than half way through) and results for the Summer Series are:

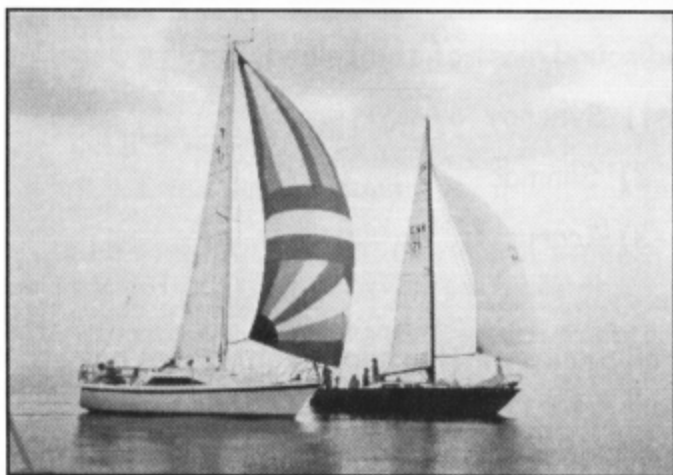

Be R Guest overtakes Black Knight in summer series

Due to Popular Demand here is that fantastic & easy to make on a boat dessert recipe from the Prime Rib Dinner..

Allegria's Trifle

1 angel food cake cut into $\frac{1}{4}$ inch thick slices

2 cans President's Choice Devon custard

1 container (624 g.) Kozy Shack chocolate pudding

2 containers of fresh raspberries (4 cups)

1 container of fresh blueberries (2 cups)

Mix together $\frac{1}{4}$ cup grenadine or any fruit syrup and $\frac{1}{3}$ cup rum or any alcohol

$\frac{1}{4}$ cup chopped roasted almonds

In a clear 2 quart bowl:

Spoon $\frac{1}{4}$ cup Devon custard, Arrange $\frac{1}{3}$ of cake slices in a single layer over custard, Brush some of the grenadine/rum mixture over the cake slices just until wet, Sprinkle about a cup of raspberries over cake.

Spread $1\frac{1}{4}$ cup of Devon custard over raspberries, arrange another $\frac{1}{3}$ of cake slices over custard, Brush with grenadine/rum mixture, Sprinkle about 1 cup of blueberries over cake.

Spread enough chocolate pudding to cover cake, arrange remaining cake slices over chocolate pudding, Brush with remaining grenadine/rum mixture

Spread $1\frac{1}{2}$ cup of Devon custard over cake, Sprinkle with a mixture of raspberries, blueberries and chopped roasted almonds

Cover and chill at least 4 hours. Serves 8 - 10 people

The nights have become cooler and the weather pattern is changing – fall is on the way! We have had a beautiful season so far and would like to extend many thanks to all you for making our days so enjoyable. Our fall hours will begin on Sept. 2nd. The fuel dock will be open from 8 – 5 Mon to Fri, the office will be open 9 – 5 Mon to Fri., 11 – 5 on Sunday.

We are now accepting appointments for haulouts and pressure washing. Midweek haulouts are on Mon, Wed & Fri. Weekend haulouts are on Sat, Oct 19 for boats up to 27", and Sat, Oct 26 for boats 28' – 36'. Please call the office to make an appointment for boats 37" and over. Remember to advise us in advance if you have any special requirements (ie: early/late launch, major repair work, etc.)

Any paint sanding or scraping jobs must have tarps to capture the paint dust/chips. For best and easiest results, use a proper dustless sander (the kind that is connected to a shop vac). Put the material in a strong, sealed garbage bag and dispose directly into the garbage dumpster (not the garbage cans).

Now is the time to think about cradle maintenance. Make sure the wood and carpet on your cradle pads are in good shape. Lightly grease the threaded rods using white lithium grease. Snug up the cradle pad hinge bolts

so they will stay at the angle they are adjusted to. The Marina will charge time (\$50/hr) and materials for any cradle repairs it has to undertake.

Mast desteepping will be done by appointment on a first come, first serve basis. Please ensure all your rigging is organized and ready before you arrive at the mast crane (boom and sails off, cotter pins removed, lower shroud turnbuckles off). It is prudent to mark your mast with your boat name. Cover or plug the ends of your mast to prevent birds from nesting in the spring. Do not secure tarps or rigging with duct tape as it will not stand up to the weather. Use cord or rope instead.

Waste oil and/or antifreeze must be handed over to our staff for proper recycling.

More Thoughts on Safety

Operators of motorized craft under 4 meters. Don't forget proof of competency is required on board as of 15 September 2002. See the notice boards and the commodore for further details of examinations.

Lifebuoys. Seen in the Safe Boating Guide. The size is to be 610 mm or larger. The 508 mm diameter buoy and the horseshoe do not meet the lifebuoy requirement

Jacklines. Members are encouraged to have a look at our commodore's jacklines. They are quick and easy to fit before setting out. They are flat so they may be stepped on without the risk of twisting an ankle as there is with round (wire) jacklines. They run the full length of the boat so one is secure before leaving the cockpit and remains so until returning to the cockpit. However, the old saying "one hand for the ship and one hand for yourself" should still be kept clearly in mind.

Man Overboard Dummy. I have (I think) all the bits and pieces to make a dummy in the back of our car. However, since we were separated from our car for a good part of the summer, we still do not have a proper man overboard-training device. I also remember some days this summer when it was so hot that I did not feel

like doing anything no matter how important.

Winter Courses. It won't be long before Power Squadron and other courses begin. I recommend you at least have a look at what is being given. Something new may have been added or perhaps a repeat of a course already taken would be of value and interest. Or maybe these folks giving courses need an instructor. Think about it. (the pay is lousy, though)

May the rest of the boating season be a safe and happy one.

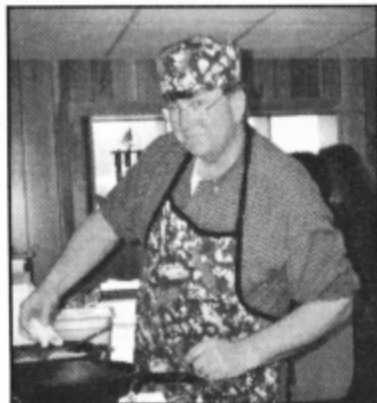
CBYC Executive Social

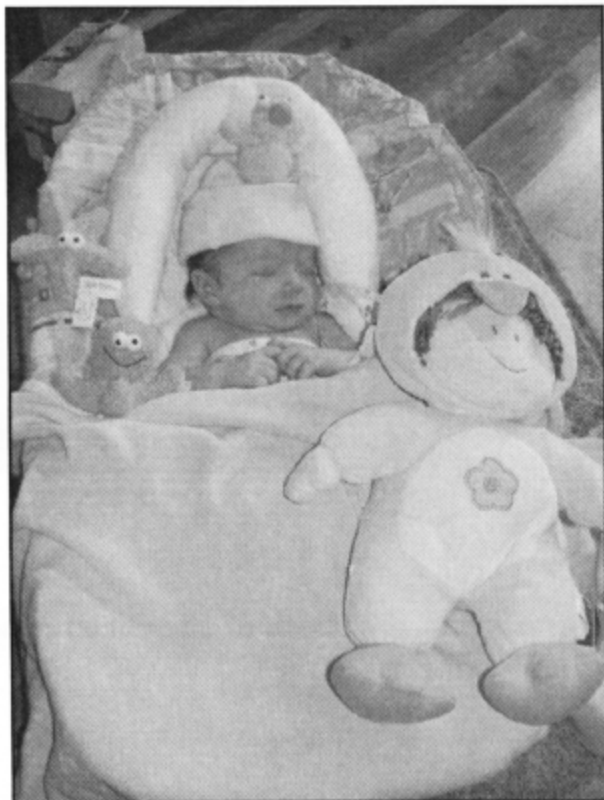

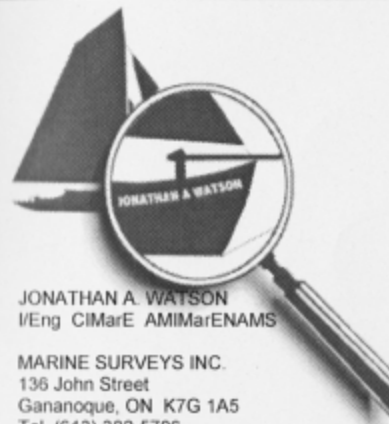
