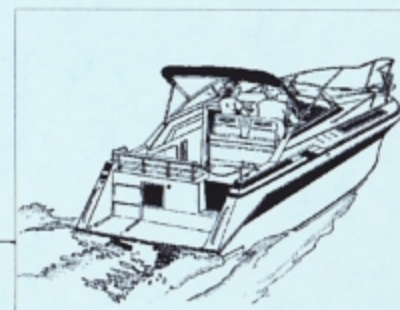

We will be away the last two weeks of June, so the July Mixer will be a little late, keep an eye on the bulletin board for any events or activities in early July.

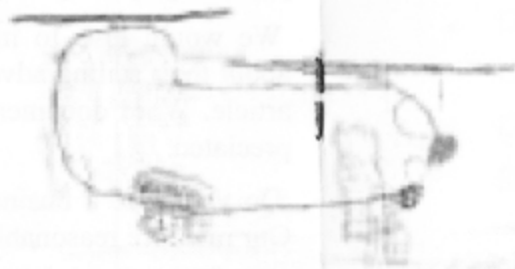

FAMILY DAY

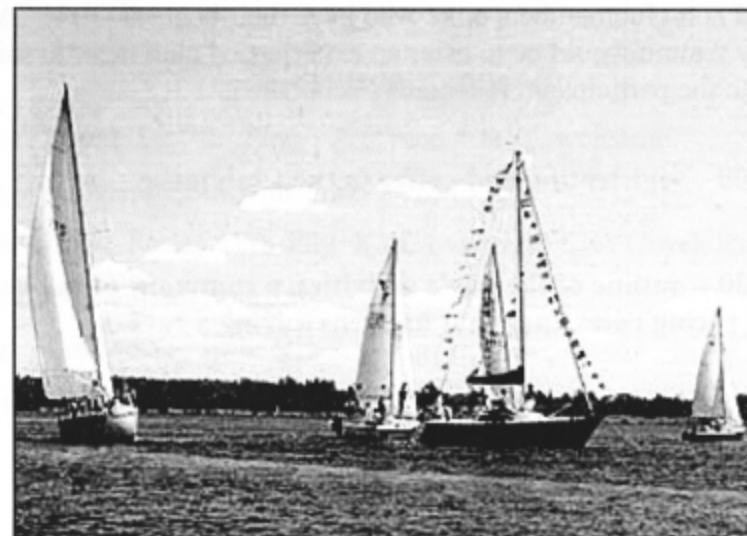
Plans for Family Day (7 June) are progressing, and posters announcing the event will soon be up the clubhouse and wash-rooms notice boards.

2003 Reciprocal Program

As you may know, through the generosity of Collins Bay Marina, we are able to participate in a reciprocal program with other clubs.
