### 2003 Marblehead - Halifax Race




The Royal Nova Scotia Yacht Squadron played host with good ole fashion down-east hospitality washed down with Keith's IPA and Gosling's dark rum.



# Mike's Nightmare ...the dock from hell!


(Continued from July)


