### **Spring Ahoy!**

The sun is out and the melting snow are two key signals of the seasons changing for any sailor. And the CBYC Sailing School is no different. It's March - our website has been updated (thank you Phil), registration forms sent out to last year's students and we're ready to roll for the 2007 season. Now it's pass-the-word time.

If you know anyone interested in learning how to sail or have children or grandchildren looking for a new adventure this summer, please don't hesitate to suggest they check out our program. All the info they need (and the registration form) is clearly outlined on the club website. If they have further questions, suggest they get in touch with Ed Billing or Sarah Visser whose contact info is right at the top of the web page. The Sailing School was full last summer. We couldn't fit extra students in any session. We intend to have the same situation this year.

We have added this summer the opportunity for students to return for instruction at an advanced level – Bronze IV. We are contemplating offering Bronze V for adults as well.

Anything you can do to pass the word will help to ensure that the CBYC Sailing School continues to offer this great program on the fabulous waters of Collins Bay. We have the best location to learn how to sail in Kingston and one of the most modern sailing school fleets around. Let's blow our horns – we've worked very hard to get where we are.


