

As you know everyone will need a boater's card (proof of competency) by 15th September irrespective of the size of power boat. To help members get the card we are going to provide testing in the clubhouse on June 6th from 10:00am to 1:00 pm. Please register before the test and get a study manual. There is a signup sheet in the marina office.

Also we are providing a short training session in the afternoon starting at 2pm (1400hrs) for folk under 17 followed by tests specially designed for 8-12year olds and 13-16 year olds. The session and test should take around 2 hours. Over 16's take one of the adult tests.

You will get a certificate on the spot which acts like the card for 60 days and the card will be mailed to you directly by CYA.

The cost is \$35 for Adults & \$30 for under 17's. These include the manual the test and processing and card fees. Any profits will go to the club funds.





Your Mixer Editor would like to take this opportunity encourage all CBYC members to read the International Water Levels Coalition newsletter which was included in their Collins Bay Marina renewal package.

Do whatever you can, e.g. become informed and write or email your MPP and MLA expressing your concerns.

Some highlights of the IWLC Jan 09 newsletter:

The St. Lawrence River Board of Control did not release "too much" water early in the 2008 season and above average rainfall prevented the draught-like conditions we experienced in 2007.

With new administrations in both the U.S. and Canada we can expect a turnover at the IJC and the Board of Control. Now is the time to ensure that the new commissioners take all interests into account, approve a new regulation plan, and appoint new Board of Control members whose purpose is not restricted to satisfying their neighbours at the expense of everyone else.

Our efforts this past year killed Plan 2007, a horrible regulation plan, and kept the Board of Control sensitive to public opinion. A continued public response effort may yield a good regulation plan and the procedures to make it even better. Complacency is not an option.


Photo Tips for the Sailing Season



Shooting in the dark, the key is to wait until you actually think it's too late. Use a tripod and 3-4 second exposure to get a nice balance between the boom (boat) lights and the sky.




Living colour: with a lot of sunlight the trick is finding a good angle where the sun hits the subjects nicely.



With a waterproof housing get right in the water and shoot half over and half under the water.

Early morning gives more saturated colours. Use a 16-35mm

wide angle lens and get very close to the subject. Try shooting upwards for a big sky affect.



For the perception of extreme speed secure the camera to the boat and use a 1 second exposure. Bean-bag attachments work well for longer exposures.
