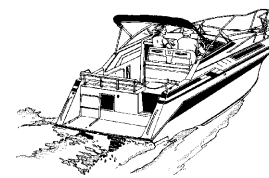

Commodore's Corner

The weekend of June 20th and 21st is full of CBYC activities. Saturday, June 20th is our annual "Fun Day". There are three events planned for that day: the Annual Sail Past in the morning; Dinghy races in the afternoon and the Commodore's Bash later in the day. Decorate your boat, meet new club members, visit with your dock mates and enjoy a delicious barbecue on the lawn of Collins Bay Marina.

All sailboat Captains look forward to the Sail Past which marks the official opening of the sailing season. Phil Morris, our Fleet Captain, is organizing this event and has prepared a detailed protocol which can be found on page ? of this Newsletter. All club Captains will meet at 1000 for coffee and muffins in preparation for the Skipper's meeting at 1030 to ensure they understand the correct protocol for the Sail Past. The Com-

modore will exit the harbour and bring her boat safely to anchor. Other Captains will follow in an orderly fashion. The Sail past gives Captains the opportunity to provide some sign of respect to their Commodore. Following this, Captains can either return to the marina, or continue on out the bay for a short sail. Prizes will later be awarded to participating boats for the best dressed boat, crew and deportment. This is a serious challenge to outdo your neighbours! In the past, CBYC members have proven to be very creative and the sea of colours observed from across the bay is most impressive!

The CBYC Sailing School is organizing the Dinghy Races. The Skippers meeting will be held at 1330 and the races will begin at 1400. This popular event will be the wettest and liveliest part of the day. Everyone is invited to join in, whether you have dinghy sailing experience or not. You can join in with a partner, or by

yourself and you will be paired with someone else who is looking for a mate. Prizes will also be awarded later in the day for the winner(s?) of these races.

For the younger folks, organized games will be held on the lawn around 1600.

At 1700 we will gather on the lawn for the Commodore's Bash. We will welcome our new members and award prizes for the earlier activities. This will be followed by a delicious barbecue at 1800. Sailing School

Another school year gone by means sailing season is fast on the approach, and Collins bay has four sailing instructors ready to refill their bank accounts and work on their summer tans! All kidding aside, we have the same great crew as last summer – minus Claudette whose parents have relocated to Toronto and with the addition of CJ Flynn who was promoted from staff to instructor. The school's adult training schedule has changed in the interest of promoting racing. Lessons will be moved from Tuesday and Thursday to Monday and Wednesday evenings, and will include a part time membership for those enrolled – this means CREWS to fill the rails! Students will be encouraged to find boats to join on Thursday night and weekend races to give them experience in both keel boats and dinghy's as well as a chance to try the competitive side of sailing. We'll also be running another, two weekend adult course in June in response to their great success last year.

CYA has re-organized its qualification guidelines to streamline their programs; as a result White Sail Instructor, Bronze Sail Instructor and Program Manager have replaced the old levels green, blue and red. CJ Flynn and Lynsey Yates will be our returning White Sail Instructors, Jordan Allan our Bronze Instructor, yours truly as a Program Manager and Kanon Clifford as our Assistant Instructor. A new PS2000 Club 420 will be added to the fleet to accommodate growing bronze numbers.

The official start to the 2009 sailing season is June 20. Mark your calendars! The day will begin with muffins and coffee at the skippers meeting and end with our BBQ at 6:00. Bring your own beverages, plates, and cutlery. Kids fare will be available at no charge. [Tickets are on sale at the marina office for \\$18.00 per person until June 14th. After that date tickets will be \\$20.00 per person so buy early!](#)

The next day June 21st will be our first Pancake Breakfast. Everyone is welcome. The racers will be out before the Amherst Island race and those who want to sleep in can come later, we're flipping until 10:00.

It's going to be a busy, fun-filled weekend so make your plans early and join us in starting the season off with a great time!!

From the Fleet Captain—Sail-Past Protocol

The following assumes that the wind will be light and SSW (into Collins Bay). In the event of different wind conditions this protocol may be modified at the skipper's meeting.

A skippers meeting will be held by the Fleet Captain at 10:30 to review and if necessary modify the protocol depending on wind conditions, and to establish the order of boats in the Sail-Past. The Sail-Past will commence at 11:15, also subject to review.

The Commodore's Yacht will be anchored in the middle of Collins Bay head to wind and boats will circle in a clockwise direction viewed from above to pass aft of the Stern of the Commodore's yacht on a beam reach.

Sailboats are to be sailed under main and jib alone. Auxiliary power may be used, when available to maintain position and safety.

The reviewing point is aft the Commodore's Yacht. The marshalling point for all boats participating in the Sail Past will be a reasonable distance from the reviewing point as determined by wind conditions. Yachts are to proceed to the designated marshalling area and take their assigned station. The fleet should generally have the large sailboats leading, power boats to tail. The Fleet Captain should be last.

Yachts should be sailed from the marshalling area to the Reviewing Point, line-a-stern, at 30 metre intervals. On approaching the Reviewing Point, yachts salute from two boat lengths before the Reviewing Point to two boat lengths after.

For the Review itself, lead yachts are to maintain a speed that allows following boats to keep in station. In favourable winds, sails should be set up so as not to exceed four knots of speed.

An appropriate Salute consists of "dipping" the ensign, with the Skipper and crew facing the Commodore's Yacht with head gear doffed. Boats without ensigns will salute by luffing the jib. The salute will be taken by the Commodore. Once the salute is complete boats will leave the area taking care not to interfere with following boats.

Boat dress for the occasion is appropriate sized ensign and burgee. At the skippers option the boat may be fully dressed. There will be prizes for the best dressed boat and the best dressed crew as judged by the Commodore's party.

The radio frequency to monitor for the Sail Past is VHF channel 06. Those with VHF sets will relay information to those without. In the event of an emergency, a warning will be broadcast to all vessels. For safety, the accepted rules of the road are to be observed.

Wind and rain were the order of the day but still, 66 brave souls bundled up and arrived to scarf down cheese, veggies, dip and fruit. Coincidentally people brought wine as well! It was a great success in spite of the weather and who can forget the commodore singing her Bay of Quinte sea shanties accompanied by her husband on the zither!! New members Fred Gregory and Diann Lawton there as well who have now brought their boat Moksha II to Collins Bay. Although the club house was rockin’, all the lines held fast and we stayed tied to the dock! Many thanks go to Carole Martin and Crystal Baker who helped Social Chair Pat Redford to put on the affair.

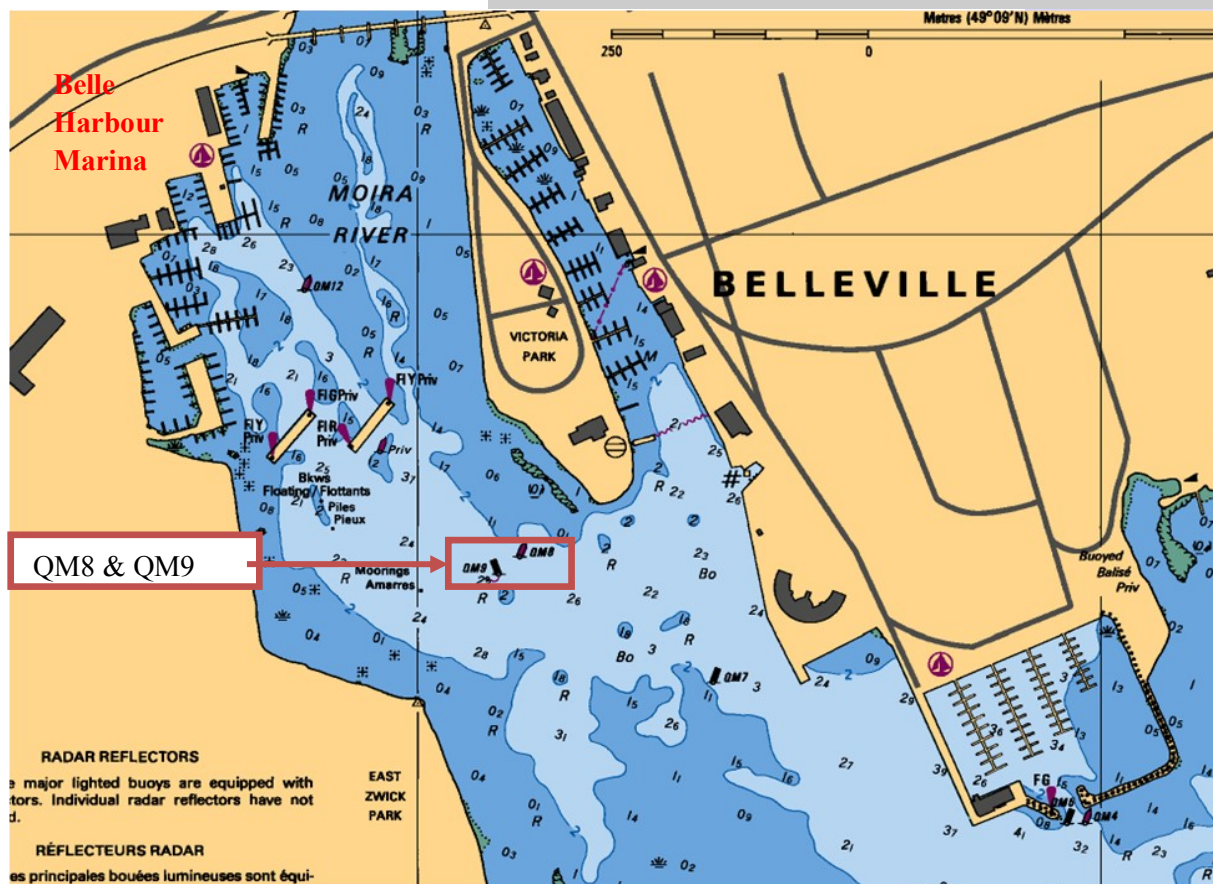
